

# Sechs Ecossaisen

## G.84



*Verzeichniss über Zwei Hundert meiner Compositionen*

*Transcriptions*

These are the initials of “Sechs Ecossaisen”, G.84 by the Danish composer Georg Gerson (1790–1825) as listed in the composer’s own thematic catalogue, “Verzeichniß über Zwei Hundert meiner Compositionen”.<sup>1</sup> According to the catalogue the 6 ecossaises were composed October 1814 and published by Lose under the pseudonym “George Orgens”. In his register on Danish music, 1750–1854<sup>2</sup> Dan Fog lists this collection under Orgens as “6 nye skotske danse” from 1814 plus “6 nye skotske danse, 2. Samling” from 1816, both published by Lose;<sup>3</sup> Dan Fog also lists the 12 ecossaises under Gerson and marks them as not preserved. To the editor’s best knowledge we have no other sources of these 3 collections unless the 6 écossaises G.93, composed 1815 are actually identical to those in the music print from 1816.
