1. Allemande

System 4 (Measures 10-12):

- Flûte: Measure 10: quarter notes G4, A4, B4, C5. Measure 11: quarter notes B4, A4, G4, F4. Measure 12: quarter notes E4, D4, C4, B3.
- Basse: Measure 10: whole rest. Measure 11: quarter notes G3, A3, B3, C4. Measure 12: quarter notes B3, A3, G3, F3. Figured bass: 6 6 6 (under measure 11); 5̇ 6 6 (under measure 12).
